Living in Territorial Days

In the 1820s, frontiersmen gathered at the *Gazette* newspaper's print shop or in Mr. Hinderliter's grog shop to listen and argue about the topics of the day. Today, in those same territorial buildings, Arkansas students can listen and argue about the same topics – like river travel, Indian removal, slavery in the new territory. The difference? Today it counts as state and U.S. history for the students! In Little Rock's oldest buildings, talk big ideas and examine everyday life of Arkansas's Territorial Days.
