Living in a Log House

Assisted by costumed demonstrators, students "live" at the Plum Bayou Log House for a morning, doing what pioneer kids did to help their families. They churn butter for fresh baked cornbread. They explore pioneer lighting and dip their own beeswax candles. They card wool and see how to spin it into thread. It's a great hands-on lesson in how pioneers satisfied their basic needs.
