Packing to Go

Who came to pre-Civil War Arkansas? Why? From where? What did they pack and how did they travel? Did they all want to come? Students find these answers as they pack food, clothing and shelter for four different immigrants to early Arkansas. The characters are a German school master, a North Carolina slave girl, a Cherokee boy and a Scottish family. During the second hour students visit pre-Civil War homes and hear more stories about pioneers moving to Arkansas.
