Living in a Frontier City

Searching for what pioneers used in their everyday lives, students on this program explore Little Rock's oldest building, a backyard with a well, kitchen, gardens and smoke house. They will also visit the home of a man soon headed for the Gold Rush. The search will turn up a bearskin someone traded for a meal, a broom made of corn shucks and a chamber pot stored under the bed. What about what they *don't* find? That is a lesson as well!
