Then and Now in Arkansas

Students rotate to three stations filled with reproduction items. They are items Arkansas pioneers used to satisfy their needs for food, clothing and shelter. Students can touch everything since they are all reproductions. Each station also has modern items used today, prompting lively discussion as students compare and contrast and think about changes over time.

Places visited: The Hands-on History Room
(located in the museum)

The cost of this program is \$3 per student and can accommodate up to 45 students and adults. The program lasts one hour. This program is available seasonally: one day a week in March, April, May, October and November. Weather details: You will be inside the museum.



You can also do two programs in one day: "Then and Now in Arkansas" and "[Living in a Frontier City](#)." If you do both programs, you can bring up to 90 children and split them into two groups that will do each program back to back. Doing both programs takes two hours, and the total cost is \$4 a child.
